

Guideline for Submissions to the New Collection

3,000 – 5,000 words, any discipline. This may be an essay previously submitted for coursework or a chapter from a dissertation.

All members of the MCR, including first years and those just graduated are encouraged to submit.

Email submissions to: newmcrjournal@gmail.com. Submissions should be in Microsoft Word format.

In email, please also include the "Submission Coversheet," which can be found on the journal website: <http://mcr.new.ox.ac.uk/journal/>

No hard copy submissions are necessary.

Please use whatever reference style is appropriate for your discipline.

Authors will have the choice of whether or not they would like their submissions considered working papers whereby readers are asked not to cite the work without the author's permission. This is to help ensure that publication in the MCR journal does not preclude publication elsewhere.

Review Process

The New Collection uses a peer-review process. Typically, these reviews are "blind," which means the reviewers are not aware of the identity of the authors. In the first stage of the review process, the author is notified of the receipt of his or her submission. Once you receive notice, the work is submitted to two or more reviewers for blind review. Based on the comments of the reviewers, the editors determine whether the submission is appropriate for the journal and whether the work is of the quality necessary for publication. If the work is deemed to require further work prior to publication, the editors will provide the author with recommendations for revising the submission for future publication. Upon acceptance, work enters the copyediting phase of the process. Authors of accepted work receive a galley proof of their work before it goes to print, and they are given an opportunity to make any last minute corrections.
